Notes:

- The "Responsible entity" is responsible for providing an accurate Container Weight Declaration (CWD). This is usually the person in Australia who engages the road carrier or offers the container for transport by road in Australia.
- Separating the weight of the container and its contents ensures there is no confusion as to whether the declared weight is a net weight or a gross weight. This enables the person who is relying on the CWD to determine its likely accuracy.
- The contents of the CWD must be readily available to an authorised officer or police officer who seeks to ascertain its contents, there and then in the presence of the container (whether by examining documents located on or in the vehicle or by obtaining the information by radio or mobile or other means).
- SOLAS Chapter VI-2 requires ALL containers to have a Verified Gross Mass (VGM) prior to container being delivered for export. Should this not be provided, the vessel master/terminal will NOT load the container until a VGM is obtained and communicated to the terminal – additional costs may be incurred.
- Where containers are required to go via weighbridge to verify the gross mass, additional costs will be incurred by the exporter including via weighbridge and weighbridge fee.
- Weighing equipment used meets the applicable accuracy standards and requirements of the Australian National Measurement Act 1999 and regulations.
- Failure to provide VGM may result in Strict Liability Penalties as per Marine Order 42 (MO42) Div 2, 11.
- Information contained in the Container Weight Declaration is provided to Clarke Global Logistics Pty Ltd by the responsible entity. Clarke Global Logistics Pty Ltd accepts no liability for any losses arising from any inaccuracy of information provided to Clarke Global Logistics Pty Ltd by the responsible entity.

The Verified Gross Mass (VGM) and Container Weight Declaration (CWD) is a statutory requirement for all container movements and should be sent no later than the day prior to the scheduled movement.
